



After many years of on-again, off-again attempts to restore the 1913 Baldwin Steam Locomotive #14, a 2-8-0, the job is finally complete. Fillmore & Western enlisted some of the most knowledgeable and proficient "steam mechanics" in the business. They worked their magic, putting in countless hours, working with boiler and welding experts, researching the decades-old schematics and adapting and retooling the tender, trucks and body. It all required a large capital investment, but is anticipated to attract many thousands of railfans and ultimately film production companies seeking an authentic steam locomotive. 2011. Back in service after a 50-year absence, the #14 will reign as "Queen of the Santa Paula Branch Line"
